From October 21 to 25, 2024, the Common Module "Common Security and Defence Policy" took place at the Theresan Military Academy in Wiener Neustadt under the direction of Col Assoc. Prof. Hon. Sen. Harald Gell, PhD, MSc, MSD, MBA. 102 participants various nationalities took part in the course. These included 54 Austrian officer cadets of the promotion "Generaloberst Josef Roth" and 48 international

officer cadets and guests from Bosnia, Canada, the Czech Republic, Germany, Italy, Lithuania, North Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Spain, and the USA. The event therefore offered a unique opportunity for exchange and further training in the international military field.

Preparations

The Austrian cadets were already involved in the organisation of the course. They contacted the lecturers in advance, prepared the rooms and organised various events that were held during the week. By being involved in the preparation and execution of the course, all participants were also able to actively participate in the design of the Common Module.

Starting with the political aspects, moving on to military strategic issues and ending with concrete experience reports from multinational missions, a comprehensive approach could be emerged.
